Can you imagine this accent preaching from a pulpit in New York? Delhi is at the foot of the Catskill Mountains and is currently being covered in a blanket of snow.

As I leave Lakeside please know that I leave you in the very capable hands of Rev. Jack Noble. He is highly experienced and has done incredible work throughout his career. I pray you are a blessing to him as you have been with me. And this is not goodbye for I will be visiting mom and Harlan, and you'll most definitely see me in the pews with you.



Introducing Reverend Jack Noble

Jack Noble comes to Lakeside after nearly five decades of ordained ministry, having served as pastor in four distinctly unique congregations in a variety of community settings.

After growing up on a farm in California and receiving his undergraduate degree from Southern California College (now Vanguard University), Costa Mesa he continued his education at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, Pittsburgh. He received his first call to become the pastor of Hope United Presbyterian Church, Plainfield, Indiana. There he served a small congregation in a suburb of Indianapolis for three years. From there, in 1974, he was called to serve the good folk of Calvary Presbyterian Church, Alexandria, Virginia. During his nearly ten years at Calvary he led the congregation to significant outreach to the surrounding community through a mentoring program with a neighboring school; additionally the church came to serve as a sheltered workshop for developmentally challenged adults; and started a second worship service. Further under his leadership the congregation became a key player in the establishment of the United Community Ministries, an outreach to areas of poverty in southern Fairfax County.

In 1982 Revered Noble was called to serve Canyon Creek Presbyterian Church, Richardson, Texas. There he led the congregation to its most dramatic period of growth – doubling and tripling the membership. While there the church started a successful elementary school; instituted a third worship; increased the size of the staff; and undertook a major renovation project. Beyond those mileposts, the congregation took on the leadership in establishing two programs ministering to the poor in Dallas and Dallas County.

In the Fall of 1994 there was a call extended to become the pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Pompano Beach (better known in that community as the Pink Church). Across nearly twenty years there the congregation undertook four major building or renovation projects. Additionally there again the church established an elementary school.

After eighteen years, in 2013, Reverend Noble retired and in mid-2014 he became the interim pastor at First Presbyterian Church Tequesta/Jupiter. Upon the call of a new pastor he left the position there in mid-2016.




Easter Lilies





Happy Birthday, Lakeside!! We are 65 years old!

October 28, 1951 - the first service of what was then known as Forest Hills Presbyterian Church was held at the Braille Club with Dr. Charles Wingerd of Chautauqua, New York, as stated supply.

<u>February 25, 1952</u> - Forest Hill Presbyterian Church held its constitution service and installed the Reverend Richard Newmann as pastor – and a new church was born.

February 9, 1954 – Current property on Flagler Drive was purchased for \$18,000

September 25, 1955 - Reverend Charles St. Clair Jeans of Canada was installed as pastor

<u>June 3, 1956</u> – Ground breaking ceremony for first buildings of Forest Hill Presbyterian

November 19, 1956 – The name was changed to Lakeside Presbyterian Church

December 9, 1956 – Fellowship Hall and Sunday School wing dedicated

February 16, 1958 – Reverend Donald Scott was called to ministry at Lakeside

April 26, 1964 – Ground breaking ceremony for sanctuary

November 29, 1964 - The sanctuary was dedicated on the first Sunday of Advent

June 28, 1970 – The Reverend Harold (Jack) Ogden was called to ministry at Lakeside

May 21, 1978 - Reverend Robert Piper was called to start in July as pastor of Lakeside

February 21, 1982 - The stained glass cross window was dedicated

June 2, 1985 – Reverend Robert Collins was called to begin as pastor on July 25

August 30, 1998 - Ground breaking ceremony for new CE building

November 7, 1999 – CE Building dedicated

June 1, 2007 – Reverend Ryan Baer installed as pastor



Property Committee Report Submitted by Ken Woodcum

The plans for the bathrooms are in the permit process.

The next Church Workday will be **April 1**st. The intended focus will be to relocate the material in the "Abyss".

There are several locks that need to be repaired, the front south east sanctuary door, the door to the minister's balcony and the east door to the C.E. room. Wilson and Rowen will be contacted.

Cassidy replaced some worn belts upon their quarterly inspection.

A new battery has been installed in the defibrillator located in the narthex.

The first aid kits which were made up several years ago need replacing. Three should be purchased and placed in the nursery, the narthex and in the room next to the pulpit.

The Property Committee has agreed to meet on the second Sunday of the month after the worship service.

There was a conflict of meeting time between painting class and Classical Conversations. The contract with Classical Conversations was examined and their time goes to 1 PM. Betty Hudson has agreed to change the starting to 1 PM.

An issue has been identified with the fence adjoining our western parking lot and the fence at 122 Edmor Road. The fence is in approximately 2 feet over the property line. Harlan and Ken Woodcum spoke with the property owner. We agreed that moving the fence would be impractical. The owner has agreed to sign a statement indicating that the indicates that the fence is encroached on our property. Some of the parking curbs are against the fence. The owner has agreed to have the curbs moved so that vehicles cannot strike the fence. One of our member's car received overspray when the fence was being finished. The owner has agreed to pay for the damage.
